HISTORY BEHIND WORLD PHOTOGRAPHY DAY

The day originated from the invention of the Daguerreotype, a photographic process developed by Frenchmen Louis Daguerre and

Joseph Nicephore Niepce in 1837.

On 9 January, 1839, the French Academy of Sciences announced the Daguerreotype process and on 19 August, the French government purchased the patent and announced the invention as a free gift to the world. Following this, on 19 August, 2010, the first global online gallery was hoisted where almost 270 photographers shared their pictures and people from over 100 countries visited the website marking the first official and globally-reaching World Photography Day.
