**CMRL Will Provide Pedestrians Facilities To Ensure Seamless Movement** 

## In phase-2, metro will link transit systems at 16 interchange stations

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hen the 118.9km phase-2 of metro rail opens in a decade, it will not only connect the suburbs to the city but also interlink different modes of transport.

At the heart of this network will be interchange stations which will make commuting from Madhavaram and Siruseri to the core city hassle-free.

As the detailed design is being prepared for the 52km priority corridor and another 10km line, Chennai Metro Rail Ltd (CMRL) has confirmed that commuters can choose from 16 stations to shift between two metro corridors, move to suburban or MRTS line, or board an MTC bus from a depot. These include interchanges at Perambur, Chetpet, Adyar, Nandanam, Kodambakkam, Alandur, Anna Nagar and Villivakkam.

Construction of the 52km priority corridor (part of corridors 3 and 5) — that will link Madhavaram to Sholinganallur, and Madhavaram to CMBT will be taken up this year. The 10km will be part of corridor 4 linking Lighthouse to Vadapalani.

"Interchange stations will be linked through pedestrian subways, pathways, foot over-bridges or skywalks for easy movement of passengers," an

At present, the 45km phase-1 has interchanges at Central, Alandur, Egmore, St Thomas Mount, CMBT, Mannadi and the airport.

In phase-2, between Madhavaram and Sholinganallur, there will be seven stations where commuters can change metro corridors or opt for another mode of transport. A commuter heading from Madhavaram to the airport can disembark at Chetpet and board a suburban train on the Beach-Tambaram route to reach the airport.

In the same corridor, while Aynavaram and Adyar depots may give easy access to MTC buses, commuters can shift between two metro corridors at Kilpauk. A passenger travelling from the northern suburbs along Madhavaram or southern fringes along OMR can reach Egmore or Central by shifting between the two corridors at Kilpauk.

In the line between Madhavaram and CMBT. CMRL has planned six interchange stations. The new corridor will be linked to existing phase-1 stations at St Thomas Mount, Alandur and CMBT. It means, a passenger heading from Kovilambakkam or Perumbakkam on the OMR towards the airport or central station could shift corridors at Alandur or CMBT or move to suburban services at St Thomas Mount.

At Villivakkam station, commuters can access Villivakkam suburban station to travel on Central-Tiruvallur suburban line, or head to Villivakkam bus terminus.

On the line between Lighthouse and Vadapalani. Nandanam, Kodambakkam and Vadapalani have been planned as interchange stations. While Nandanam and Vadapalani will be linked with those built in phase-1, commuters can shift to suburban train services at Kodambakkam.
