For station, Metro acquires land from Good Shepherd

School parts with 17,495 sq. ft. for Sterling Rd. station

After a long negotiation, Good Shepherd School in Nungambakkam has given land for constructing the Sterling Road Metro station, part of Chennai Metro's Phase II project.

The private school has given 17,495 sq. ft. of land from its premises for building the station, and Chennai Metro has handed over a cheque for acquiring the piece of land, according to a press release.

CMRL officials refused to reveal the amount paid for acquiring the parcel of land from the school.



Construction work for the Phase-II project is likely to start in a couple of months.

CMRL will need additional land for the station and officials are in the process of acquiring more land from other private landowners, said sources.

For months now, CMRL has been in the process of acquiring land for its Phase II project, that will cover 118.9

Metro-suburban link

Tunnelling work to begin For the project, CMRL will need 117.12 hectares for three stretches – Madhavaram to Shollinganallur, Madhavaram to SIPCOT and Light House to Poonamallee. CMRL-began issuing notices to landowners last year, in this regard.
