

Manifold increase in CMRL footfall

Chennai: In a manifold increase in patronage since the lockdown was relaxed, a total of 8.58 lakh passengers travelled in the Chennai Metro trains in November. According to a statement from the Chennai Metro Rail Limited (CMRL), a total of 3,60,193 passengers travelled in September after the services resumed, while the figure almost doubled to 7,03,223 in October. Meanwhile, a total of 19,21,962 passengers have taken the metro services so far since September. In November, a total of 21,579 passengers utilised the recently launched QR-code ticketing system. "Also, 4,72,027 passengers have used the Travel Card Ticketing System. CMRL offers a 20 per cent discount on QR-code ticketing for single journey, return journey, Group QR Ticket and QR Trip passes," the statement said. A 10 per cent discount is already available for passengers using travel cards.
