hennai Corporation's volunteers will count those above 45 years who are yet to be vaccinated apart from looking for symptoms of ILI (influenza-like illness) and other symptoms in residents during the door-to-door surveys that have resumed. In the second wave, those getting infected have additional symptoms such as diarrhoea and fatigue.

The volunteers will, for now, visit houses once in two days and their number will be increased if the situation warrants it. "Please co-operate with the volunteers without any stigma. The sooner we identify symptoms, we can break the cycle of spread and critical cases and deaths can be avoided," corporation commissioner G Prakash appealed to the

The civic body will compile street-wise data of those above 45 years who have not taken the jab. It has administered close to 10 lakh doses till date, "We are targeting 30,000 doses a day and hope to achieve it in the coming days. It is also important that the public get two doses and not be complacent after getting the first dose. Only if a person gets two doses, the vaccine can work 100 %," Prakash said.
